
[Die Dagine Factory] Deadend Fa

[thism?]| The “[die dagine factory] deadend fa[thism?]|” is a classic Lebenswelt definition of the communist movement. In her Left Is Right, Right Is Wrong (November 8, 2011), editor-in-chief of Die Unbestimmten, the German Luxemburgische Woche, Olaf Zimmermann writes of the 'negations' that have marked and will mark the communist movement. For this reason it has repeatedly become a question of distinguishing an authentic communism (the "Luxemburgian" communism of Rosa Luxemburg) from the communism of the "die dagine factory," the "old," "dead" communism (as a form of the mass movement) from the "new," "tough" communism (as an opposition party).

Originally, the whole communist movement was characterized by an "all-or-nothing" approach: on one side, the communists, on the other side, the bourgeoisie. In order to get from one pole to the other, the communists were supposed to struggle against "all the rulers." This definition of the communist movement could, after all, only be understood in terms of the proletariat, since the struggle of the proletariat against the bourgeoisie is a struggle that demands all its force. So, first, only the "vanguard" of the

proletariat had to participate in a communist movement. This meant the Communist Party. However, this definition of the communist movement had a very important premise: if the communist movement was "pure," then it was necessarily "young." This means, first of all, that the labor movement was not yet developed into a mass movement, not yet into an autonomous and revolutionary communist movement. Only a pure and young labor movement would be able to take over the state and power. This was the meaning of the famous "final conflict": the proletariat was the only class that was ready for a confrontation with state power. The question was, however, in which form the final conflict would take place: the communists would either take over the state in the form of a party or they would struggle for the revolution in the streets, in the form of an independent mass movement. Second, the communist movement was understood as a young movement: the communists were supposed to be "young." However, not everyone was willing to participate in the "young" movement. Rosa Luxemburg, for example,
